Minimum Criteria

Educational Criteria

- A pass in Year 12 English, OR a pass in a suitable humanities/ social science type subject at Degree level.
- A pass in a suitable Year 12 Mathematics subject, OR a pass in a suitable Degree level Mathematics subject

OR

- A fully completed Bachelor Degree in any discipline

Associate Degree - Victoria

In addition to the above educational criteria, the Associate Degree prerequisites are as follows:

- VCE Units 3 & 4 – a study score of at least 20 in English (any) and Further Mathematics or higher. Equivalent subjects completed in other states will be assessed by Qantas and the University.

Bachelor's Degree - Victoria

In addition to the above educational criteria, the Bachelor's Degree prerequisites are as follows:

- VCE Units 3 & 4 - a study score of at least 20 in English (any) and Mathematical Methods. Please note, students must complete both Unit 3 and 4 of Mathematical Methods, however the minimum study score may be obtained in either Unit 3 or 4. Equivalent subjects completed in other states will be assessed by Qantas and the University.

Bachelor's Degree and Graduate Diploma - Queensland

In addition to the above educational criteria, the Bachelor's Degree and Graduate Diploma prerequisites are as follows:

- Sound Achievement in English, Mathematics and one of the Sciences (Physics, Chemistry or Biology). Equivalent subjects completed in other states will be assessed by Qantas and the University.

Other criteria

- Eligibility to hold a passport with unrestricted access
- Holder of Australian Permanent Residency Status
- Age 17 or greater as at 1 October, 2007
- Eligible to hold a current CASA Class 1 Medical Certificate*

Additional Information on Educational Criteria

Candidates currently completing the relevant Year 12 subjects or other education criteria are eligible to apply and can be assessed. You may be required to show evidence that you are undertaking the relevant subjects at any stage in the selection process. All candidates will need to provide evidence of their results before being offered a position on the program.

Year 12 subjects must be completed to tertiary entrance level. We are unable to accept Bridging, Trade or Diploma courses as a substitute for Year 12 subjects.

The suitability of subjects and the definition of a pass for Qantas Cadet Pilot purposes is determined by Qantas rather than the relevant educational body.

Suitable Year 12 Mathematics Subjects for Qantas purposes:

In most Australian states the lowest level Year 12 tertiary entrance maths subject is not a suitable maths subject for Qantas Cadet Pilot purposes. Unsuitable subjects include, but are not limited to: General Mathematics (NSW), Maths in Society (NSW, QLD), Social Maths (QLD), Further Mathematics (VIC), Discrete Mathematics (WA), Mathematical Methods (SA) and Mathematical Applications (SA).

Supporting documentation

Qantas will require proof of the stated minimum criteria at a point in time during the selection process. Qantas will request this documentation from you as required and it will be assessed against the detail provided by you on the application form.

Documentation that may be requested from you could include (where applicable):

- Year 11 results
- Evidence of Year 12 subjects being studied in 2007
- Year 12 interim school reports
- Year 12 trial exam results (if completed at the time of request)
- Year 12 exam results
- Degree subjects/grades and a course outline
- Australian Birth Certificate
- Current Australian passport (optional)
- Overseas passport with Australian Permanent Residency visa (where applicable)

Please have the above items readily available should they be requested from you.

***CASA Class 1 Medicals**

Holding a CASA Class 1 Medical is no longer part of the minimum criteria to apply and undertake the Cadet Pilot Program selection process. It is however a requirement to be accepted as a Cadet. Candidates who do not currently hold a CASA Class 1 Medical should be aware of this requirement and consider undertaking a CASA Class 1 Medical examination before applying or whilst undertaking the application process. It is worthwhile knowing early if you are unable to hold a CASA Class 1 Medical in order for you to avoid the costs associated with the selection process.

Those who do not hold a CASA Class 1 Medical will undertake the necessary CASA Class 1 assessments during the Occupational Health Assessment (OHA). The OHA will be undertaken only by those candidates who are competitive to move to Stage 3, as described in the Selection Process Briefing Sheet

Cadets will undertake an Australian Commercial Pilot (Aeroplane) Licence during the Cadet Pilot Program, therefore a CASA Class 2 Medical will not be acceptable.
